### Note about Schedule Changes

Students are the only ones who may make changes to their schedules. It is best to make any schedule changes as early as possible. Students can make schedule changes through the fifth day of class on Monday, September 6. New students should contact the Office of the Registrar for schedule changes. For returning students, the *Add/Drop Courses* section of Connect2 will open for schedule changes on August 17. If a course is full, a student can add themselves to the waitlist for a course by using the *Add, Waitlist, or Drop* a course link in the left menu of Connect2. To resolve questions or concerns, students can send an email to Registrar@ic.edu, but calling the Registrar's Office at 217-245-3013 is the quickest way to get an answer.

From September 7 through Monday, September 13 (the tenth day of class) at 5 p.m., students may make changes using the paper add/drop forms with faculty instructor and advisor signatures. Add/drop forms are available on Connect2 and in the Office of the Registrar. Financial aid is based on the student's enrollment at 5 p.m. on Monday, September 13. It is the student's responsibility to make sure their schedule is correct by that day. After September 13, all dropped classes will be indicated by a "W" for withdrawn on the transcript. The last day to withdraw from a class with a "W" grade will be Monday, November 1, 2021, at 5 p.m.
